

UCDB and Energisa have signed an agreement that benefits Dionysius Furnas community

Cassava flour production, brown sugar and vegetables will be strengthened with training, standardization and popularization of the brand

Tripling the production of cassava flour and brown sugar of Dionysius Furnas community and making the products reach the shelves of supermarkets are the first results expected from the partnership between the Dom Bosco Catholic University and Energisa electric utility. Currently, the community produces 800 kilos of flour and two thousand units of brown sugar per month.

The cooperation agreement in the amount of R \$ 722 thousand, more than one hundred families of the Jaraguari community will see their potential exploited through staff training, increasing production without it uncharacterized, but meeting the established norms and standards by law, the popularization of Dionysius Furnas mark, the product certification, the culture of dissemination and exploitation of production.

The signing took place on 28

June, with the participation of the Rector of UCDB Fr. Ricardo Carlos, the CEO of Energisa, Marcelo Silveira da Rocha, the president of the quilombo of Dionysius Furnas, Adriano dos Santos da Silva, and the secretaries of State for Production and Family Agriculture, Fernando Mendes Lamas, and Culture, Tourism, Entrepreneurship and Innovation, Renato Roscoe. The Deans of Directors were also present, Herivelton Breitenbach and Extension and Community Affairs, Luciane Pinho de Almeida, besides the director of Tuiuiú Foundation, Dr. Ruy de Araujo Caldas, and representatives of OCB, Famasul and Fiems.

“Good ideas and joint efforts can provide very good things for the community and we want to create a pilot project, from this, to extend the benefits. We need to enhance and discover the great vocations that the state must

give visibility to what is already being done very well, but that is hidden”, said Fr. Ricardo.

Marcelo Rocha recalled the path to the formalization of the agreement and said: “The project is embedded in the resources allocated to energy efficiency. I always believe that money should be applied in its own community of the State and not for the other states”.

Under the agreement, a

product processing unit derived from sugarcane (brown sugar and molasses), cassava (flour and starch), the extractive activity (baru, macaúba and peach palm) will be implemented, and the renovation and expansion of a multipurpose area for the community. The training and technical capabilities for improving production and business processes take place there.

Education

UCDB NEWSPAPER: What professional skills is Graduation in Education specifically concerned about?

ANA PAULA GASPAS MELIM: The course is focused on the initial training for the exercise of teaching in early childhood education and initial elementary school years in the services and school support area, as well as other areas which pedagogical knowledge are provided in the teaching of average level in youth and adults education, in vocational education courses in the services and school support area and areas that require pedagogical knowledge. It is a formation that also enables work in governmental and non-governmental agencies related to education.

In this sense, the professional skills are based on teaching as educational and purposeful action, built on social, ethnic-racial relations, following the principles and training objectives that are based on the relationship between scientific and cultural knowledge, ethical and aesthetic values through theoretical and practical studies, research and critical reflection of the educational activities in the field of education.

With the offer of the course, we intend to develop people capable of integrating technical, human and politically in the process of socio-political and cultural transformation of their time responding to the needs of children from 0 to 10 years of school and society. Furthermore, we emphasize that the professional consolidation involves a set of information and skills based on theoretical and practical knowledge related to school, research, participation in the management of educational processes and the organization and operation of systems and educational institutions in the promotion of education and citizenship.

UCDB NEWSPAPER: What are the differentiators of the UCDB course?

ANA PAULA: The Education Course of UCDB completes 54 years this year, which reveals the mission and commitment of our institution with education. Throughout our history, we seek to continually advance in training with an emphasis on reflection and research in the educational process ensuring the actual conditions for the exercise of the profession. Our educational project seeks progress and the quality of education that it aims, and is built collectively inspired by the Salesian and methodologies that address different opportunities and teaching situations in order to favor the plurality/

differences present in the course. We also highlight the infrastructure and the integration of academic research projects (Pibic), training (Pibid) and extension (Labinter).

NEWSPAPER UCDB: How is the course in UCDB?

ANA PAULA: The Education course of UCDB is offered in the forms of distance and classroom, at night, with a workload of 3,600 class hours. It has semi-annual basis, with a minimum duration of four years, eight semesters, with theoretical and practical disciplines guided by the area of professional performance. The supervised training is a curriculum component articulator and integrator of theory/practical, which gives the student the opportunity of the approach of the professional reality, with a view to the technical, cultural, scientific and educational improvement of its formation in order to prepare him/her to engage in the educational profession and citizenship.

UCDB NEWSPAPER: How is the job market for educators? What are the most promising areas of activity of the profession?

ANA PAULA: Education is a continual process. There are many job opportunities in private and public institutions as well as non-governmental, business and hospitals, considering the educator professional performance areas. Getting involved with education is continuously being inserted in the spaces in which we can undoubtedly transform the life stories of children, youth and adults, which makes the profession and professionals essential. Inspired by and paraphrasing Cora Coralina, I conclude: "Happy is the one that transfers what he/she knows and learns what he/she teaches".

Psychology

NEWSPAPER UCDB: A degree in psychology is specifically geared to which professional skills?

RENAN DA CUNHA SOARES

JUNIOR: Psychology works a lot with the worldview. The graduate student comes to have a vision of man and understands how it fits into the world as a way of his identity, likewise his health, his work, his individual relationships and with the group, they are interesting for that. Within this universe, it works a lot with scientific observation, with listening. We are typically listening professionals: we must listen to the other to put ourselves in that position and understand what things mean to him, make this reality reading and then propose an intervention. This can occur in the organizational, school, family, clinical context - Today the psychologist is inserted in several other places, including the areas of public policy, health, social care, housing, transit, in the legal field. I.e., training in psychology in Brazil is general, so the professional is enabled and can use psychology in any of these areas.

UCDB NEWSPAPER: What are the differentiators of UCDB course?

RENAN: We are the biggest Psychology course of the State with the largest number of students as well as being the oldest of Campo Grande, about to turn 41 years old. It is the only course that has, beyond graduation, developments in specialization, masters and doctorate in psychology in the state. This means that most of the professors of the course, at least 30% of them are doctors and researchers, providing undergraduate students the opportunity to participate in these surveys - that way, the student acquires not only the ability

to look and act, but also to develop paradigms. There is also a connection with the extension. So thus, we provide vision to the student that his life does not end at graduation, that means it is possible to have other careers, other interventions in Psychology.

NEWSPAPER UCDB: How is the course in UCDB?

RENAN: We offer the course in the morning and evening periods in ten semesters, with interaction between theory and practical. We have practical classes in animal and human experimental psychology laboratories, psychological evaluation laboratories. There are the basic internships and the School Clinic of Psychology that are very well equipped, allowing a unique experience of professional reality. In the course, we have two emphases: psychological assessment today and Psychology and Health in contemporaneity.

UCDB NEWSPAPER: How is the job market for psychologists? What are the most promising areas of activity of the profession?

RENAN: In the last 15, 20 years, psychology has won the labor market. Before we had one psychologist who was classically hired for the education sector, consultant or in companies in the organizational area, and the clinic. However, the Brazilian Psychology has evolved a lot - it is worth remembering that no country has as many psychologists as Brazil. Therefore, we have a very large growth not only in other private spaces as well as in public, with many public tenders in the area. Today there are psychologists working in the courts, social assistance, and health. The hospital area is also an area in which the professional is settling a lot, beyond sports, transit - not only for the evaluation of driver, but for the industry behavior work, companies working to transport people. In 1996, we had about a thousand professionals in Mato Grosso and Mato Grosso do Sul. Currently, active are 3.5000 only in MS.

Agronomy students develop agro industrial products

Five best projects of UCDB were presented to students of the Federal University of Mato Grosso do Sul

Traditional caramel and lactose free of pumpkin, banana, provolone cheese, mead, salami, mocotó jelly, pickles, kefir, craft beer, sausage, manioc, honey with pepper, passion fruit pulp, inlaid with sheep and milk with low lactose content are the products developed and presented in the classroom by the students of the 9th semester of Agronomy of the Catholic University Dom Bosco. The applied didactic is part of Food Technology course.

Divided into groups, the students had to analyze the market, assess the raw material, innovate the production, sell and manage a fictitious agribusiness. "The interesting thing about this method is that they were looking for information, which is the most valued part in today's professional. The important thing is not to fill them with knowledge, but that they know how to look for information because the most important is not only to produce. With this, they have a vision of what they could do, even as an entrepreneur. Mastering this technique, future professionals

can counsel, oversee projects, even help people in rural areas giving appreciation of ideas that they can use", said Professor Dra. Marney Pascoli Cereda.

Before setting the theme of work, the students, Gabriela Santana and Wiliam Longato visited a sweet creamery to know the work and analyze the production, and then develop the rapadurinha traditional milk, checking everything that could be improved. "The agronomy professional has to think from the field to marketing of the product. With this project, I could know more about my area and I intend to focus on this branch of agronomy", said the student.

Longato points out that there is always a way to innovate the products, doing it differently from what already exists, to make it healthier for consumption. "The professional will check how the product is harvested, processed and delivered to the customer, as we seek customer satisfaction and thus help grow the supply chain with technology," he adds.

While the students, Alexandra Santin and Patricia Borges chose to manufacture provolone cheese




with milk produced in Anhanduí, Campo Grande district. "We chose to make the provolone cheese, because there are several settlements there and it would be a way for people to buy milk from the settlers, increase their income and reduce rural exodus. Because for them, what they need the most is technical assistance, someone specialized to help on a day to day, how to produce, handle the animal for them to get greater productivity", said the academic.

For Patricia Borges, that agribusiness would solve one of the major problems of these small milk producers. "These producers of settlements sell to the dairies, which pay little for the raw material. So making the cheese, they could earn more on top of their product", he adds.

SELECTED PROJECTS

All seventeen projects were evaluated from the choice of the product to consumer acceptance, and five of the best groups were selected by the professor PhD in production engineering, Patricia Campeão, for presentation at the Federal University of Mato Grosso do Sul are: 'Brew', 'salami', 'manioc', 'lactose-free milk' and 'traditional brown sugar milk'.

"They have to think about producing, but with what will they do with what they produce. Agronomist have to focus more on planting and raw materials, but is not enough to have the raw material and not be able to add value to market. That's the challenge. And the agronomist, for being closer to the farmers, use knowledge to guide them", he concludes.



Graduated in 1981 by FUCMT, Judge Nery Sa e Silva de Azambuja, president of the Regional Labor Court of the 24th Region was also a professor of the institution.

From the student days, he highlights the mock trials and participation in student politics as important in his training. "As a professor, it highlighted a lot to see the growing generations, and especially as women stood out. When I started to teach, there were few women in the room - less than 30% - and they hardly thought of contest. Today, they represent the majority of those that passed".

He did his Masters in PUC, with encouragement from Fr. José



Marinoni, the judge Claudionor Abbs Miguel Duarte and professors José Manuel de Arruda Alvin and Teresa Celina Arruda Alvin. The major partner of Nery was his wife for over 20 years, Maria Jose Vilela Lima (in memoriam). In his career, he was Federal Prosecutor of the State until he took over as Labour Judge.

Law Course complete 50 years of commitment to society

Tradition and quality of education are trademarks of degree that has graduated thousands of alumni

To provide quality education with tradition and pioneering spirit of the Salesians is the challenge the Law course of Dom Bosco Catholic University, which this year completes 50 years of operation, being responsible for the formation of most law of Campo Grande and Mato Grosso do Sul operators.

Started in 1966, the then Catholic United Colleges of Mato Grosso (FUCMT), the graduation was the first in southern Mato Grosso then, awakening from the beginning interest of already graduated students and professionals who wanted to improve their knowledge. In these

five decades, thousands of students have passed through the Catholic banks and building society today.

Four aspects contribute to the maintenance of the course among the best: the institution's own tradition, the quality of teaching and faculty, internships and research. The assessment is of the law coordinator, Professor Elaine Cler: "Our great aim is fighting for the quality of education. For this, we train professors every six months; today, from 60 professors, 20 have enrolled in masters or doctorate. The issue of training is also our major differential: we have the Judgeship that works within

UCDB, besides the Center for Legal Practice (Nuprajur) and participation in the Itinerant Justice, one of the tribunal Court of Justice", she said.

Currently, there are 2,800 students enrolled in the ten semesters of the course, in the morning and evening periods. Some of these students are involved in research. "The Scientific Initiation Program (Pibic) is being very encouraging for students to leave a bit of Law study tradition, which is book, classroom and Professor only, to research law. We have a significant number

of students who do research with scholarships, and there is an involvement of the Master and Doctorate in Local Development. This has been a profit for us in the survey with professors", said Elaine.

LECTURERS

With a staff of 60 lecturers, a degree in Law of UCDB prioritizes titration of professors putting into the picture, the experience in the classroom and graduates of the institution also. There are few who return after years of graduation, to become professors.

One of such example is Solange Furtado, graduated in 1974 and, from 1998, became a professor at the Institution in Family Law disciplines, Succession in Roman law and in post-graduation, besides taking advisory services of the coordination. “A big difference I see in UCDB is the reception of students and professors in the institution. Here, I see the value of people. This is proven with the return of many former students to come and teach here. Several professionals who were my students today are my colleagues”, said the professor. “I myself am a graduate of the course and I am happy to work here”.

The professor gives lessons to the 1st and 9th semesters and can notice the growth of the students during the course. “They come in very young, and it is gratifying to see that, after a few semesters, they have evolved and are well prepared. I am even more satisfied after a few years, to see them returning as professors”. Two children of Solange are graduates of UCDB: The prosecutor, Luciano Furtado Loubet, and the lawyer and also a professor at the Catholic, Leonardo Furtado Loubet.

EVENT

On August 11, UCDB performs event in celebrating 50 years of law school. It will be in the indoor courts of Tamandaré campus, from 8am, delivering plaques to personalities who contributed to the strengthening of the course, graduates and authorities. Then, talk with Cássio Scarpinella Bueno will be held.

“The study of law is perennial. You have to improve during your lifetime, studying. The UCDB course is the most traditional and it allows the young student to begin to understand the functioning of a society and the need to understand that law is the greatest instrument, the most powerful of social pacification, stabilization of interpersonal relationships, and the study allows us to improve as human beings and to build a better society”.

The first director of Campo Grande Law School was Fr Pedro Ferreira in 1966. The direction then passed through, Fr Walter Bocchi (1967-1969); Fr. José Scampini, (1970-1973), Fr. Antonio Antunes de Barros Sobrinho (1977-1978); Fr. Arlindo Pereira de Lima (1978-1980); Fr Giulio Boffi (1980-1982); Fr Jair Gonçalves (1982-1984); Fr Bruno Pedron (1984-1987.); and Fr. Luigi Favero (1987-1991).

In addition to the position of director, there was also the function of the coordinator, position held by Marilza Lucia Fortes, Adhemar de Carvalho Mombrom Filho, Benjamin Padua, Nicholau Abraao, Victoriano Menezes de Villamil, Renato da Rocha Ferreira, Maucir Pauletti and Elaine Cler.

“I was the first female president of the Academic Directory Clovis Bevilacqua (Daclobe). The whole experience has contributed greatly to my humanistic and as an operator of the law. Today, my focus is entirely the role on human rights. This seed was planted there, along with colleagues, this will to want to collaborate, change the world, this voluntarism of youth has become, in fact, in an action, a life framework to guide my professional practice”.

LEGAL PRACTICE

From the 5th semester, the student has direct contact with the practice, either at the Center for Legal Practice, located at School Clinic, or in the Itinerant Justice Court, which UCDB participates in for more than 14 years.

Professor Renato Ferreira da Rocha is the lecturer responsible for Nuprajur and is in UCDB since July 1985. “I love here a lot for the following: because we join the theoretical with the practical part. It is here that I encourage our students to begin to ‘load the folder’. We do not look at them as students, but as partners, future colleagues”.



In Nuprajur, there are about 1,200 students/week. In the 5th and 6th semesters, they do the discipline of Practical Criminal Procedure and Civil and learn to prepare the pieces. From 7th to 10th semesters, they put into practice what they have seen before.

While the Judgeship Itinerant takes services to the population

in two buses that run through neighborhoods of Campo Grande. Led by Judge Cezar Luiz Miozzo, the average attendance is 60 to 70 cases per period, formalizing about 10,000 cases involving amounts of up to 40 minimum wages.

“For the students, it is a great learning experience as well as being a social work of UCDB”, said the judge, graduated in UCDB in 1985.

Dogs and cats are rehabilitated in Veterinary Hospital project

Animals receive muscular and neurological treatment in UCDB research project

Noting the high level of demand of animal physical rehabilitation service in Campo Grande, the research group PIBIC - Rehabilitation of Domestic Animals, which has existed since 2015, composed of four students of the course of Veterinary Medicine of the Don Bosco Catholic University and led by professor me. Joyce Katiuccia Medeiros, decided to help the owners of small animals (dogs and cats) offering the service free of charge at the Veterinary Hospital (Hovet) of the University of the animals that come to them. Students that were present in

the research group are Douglas Kohatsu and Eric Domingues de Oliveira of 9th semester, Ygor Garcia de Oliveira of 7th semester and Andressa Jade of 3rd semester. Professor. Cristiano Marcelo Espinola Carvalho also participates in the project.

Rehabilitation takes place both to animals indicated by professors who perform surgery in the hospital, and for animals from owners unrelated to the Hovet that bring them to the project, but that previously volunteer to perform the necessary clinical examinations and tests such as radiographic, ultrasound and

others to verify the possibility of carrying out the rehabilitation.

According to the professor, the project's aim is to treat animals of all forms, that is, to offer a complete rehabilitation: "The intention is to promote the rehabilitation of dogs and cats in the hospital. We have patients coming out of surgery and need to be rehabilitated as much muscle as neurologically, so we look for a strengthening of the animal's muscles while working in the two areas of its problem".

The rehabilitation of domestic animals still has the worry to perform the treatment with the animals separately and carefully in its two areas of work: research and practice. The practice requires all the zeal of the group, as said Douglas, who, besides studying Veterinary Medicine as well as other members of the group, holds a degree in Physical Therapy: "We're not doing parachute; we all care for our patients. We studied enough to carry out the rehabilitation and treatment of

these animals".

Eric also comments about the care that they have with the project patients: "What we are doing is not a test; we studied for this, it is an area we intend to follow. We are always looking to make the best treatment for the animal, and the professors, both hospital physicians and the professor of the project, help us".

In the area of research, as stated by the professor, the focus is on the production of knowledge from the experiences that are obtained in the treatments: "They learn and put into practice what they have studied. We can also take the content obtained in carrying out the treatments as part of the development of research", he said. Ygor agrees, saying that he is in the project "first for the knowledge, then the practice that supports for a future professional activity".

Neurea Yule started going to church at the beginning of the year regularly. "I like the homilies

of Salesian priests and for being a place that gives me a lot of peace too".

Catia Vital and her husband serve as Eucharistic ministers in the church since the end of last year. "It's a cozy church and that touched our hearts".

The church, located between the blocks A and C, was built in an area of 700 square meters, with

capacity for 520 seats, it also has modern stained glass windows at the end of the altar, Italian artist paintings of Mario Bogani, who died in the month June in a modern architecture. The intention of the Ministry of the Dean is to transform the church into University Parish, since it is linked today to the Parish St. Francis of Assisi.

"University: Ethics, Science and Society" is the main theme of the III Congress of Education, Research and Extension of UCDB - Knowledge in Action, which will be held on 26 and 27 October at the Dom Bosco Catholic University. Registration is now open and can be made by site www.ucdb.br/saberesemacao. The new feature this year is the possibility of participation of students and secondary school teachers and other higher education institutions.

Historian Leandro Karnal, PhD in Social History from the University of São Paulo (USP) and professor at the State University of Campinas (Unicamp) will give the opening lecture. He will address the main theme of the event and the presentation will be at 19h on 26 October in the courts of UCDB on the campus of Tamandare Avenue.

simultaneous events will be held in three periods: roundtables, product exhibitions and undergraduate and graduate projects, the scientific research projects, workshops, cultural attractions, stage show, Among other programs.

year, one of the novelties is that the top five items of each area will be published and the best full projects (in oral communication and in dialogic gatherings) can be selected for UCDB periodic Publisher.

DO YOU KNOW THE FLOW MANAGEMENT PROCESSES WITH PEOPLE?

To make it clear what the management with People is in a company, it is important to understand that all processes under their responsibility are part of a cycle without beginning or end, as often occur at the same time. Therefore, it is only possible to the overall understanding of the process through an exemplification flow.

By lifting the need for a new hiring or replacement, the Mana-

ger of the area sends an employee request form, and thus begins the process of recruitment and selection, which is responsible for attracting and finding candidates who can meet the profile required by the position to be filled.

After selection and profile evaluation, candidates who best meet the requested requirements, are referred to an interview with the manager, who makes his choice, and

the candidate is headed for hiring. Thereafter, the Personnel Department is responsible for carrying out the paperwork of hiring, getting the required documents, registering the point and payroll.

After the resulting record is initiated, the integration of the new employee is given, which is carried out by the area of Training and Development (T&D). It begins by presenting the company as a whole, passing necessary and important information for the developer to meet the standards, rules and the institution's values.

It follows with the evaluation of flow of the trial period, which is sent by the area of Recruitment and Selection (R&S) to the manager, who performs two performan-

ce evaluations, when the score performance is made and aligned the improvement points the employee should develop. This evaluation can lead to execution or termination, everything will depend on the analysis of the adaptation period.

With the information obtained in the various processes from monitoring and control, it is possible that the manager take individual or collective decisions, relating, for example, with greater investment in training for current or future weaknesses solutions, or in some cases, punishment or even the shutdown of the developer.

Science Club brings students of the Capital closer to Engineering projects

Six areas embraces the studies

Take leading technologies to elementary and high school students of schools is one of the main objectives of the Science Club extension project of Dom Bosco Catholic University. Actions such as robotics, 3D Printer, Soil Identification, Macaroni Bridges, Physics and Astronomy Group are developed by teachers, students, extension workers and volunteers of the Catholic.

Professor Dr. Dejahyr Lopes Junior, who decided to create in 2014 a project to be a space for discussion, dissemination, coordinate the Science Club and development of technologies related to engineering, and in addition would

add a differential in the life and the participating students. "This project is an opportunity to bring the society closer to technologies that are in discussions in engineering, enabling reflection on the processes and on the everyday consequences. While the students, asides experiencing this exchange of knowledge with the general public, can integrate their project to the research and subjects studied", said the coordinator.

Each project component performs some different activity that is related to the various engineering and has professors with knowledge in the areas for the best realization of the actions. The groups hold lectures for students of elementary and secondary school and present

activities in the Campus Day, Relationships Area of the program of UCDB (SeR) that brings students to know the University, as well as preparation of schools for national competitions.

For student, Bruna Porte Rodrigues, who is in 3rd semester of Civil Engineering and participated in the Science Club for a year, the project is interesting for the opportunity of choice that is given: "It has several subcategories, which gives the student option to choose where to practice, be it something related to your course, be it something that interests him, the important thing is to specialize to pass their knowledge to other people".

Soil Identification:

Extension workers and volunteers of Civil and Sanitary Engineering and Environmental courses take practical activities to high school and elementary students, using the touch and sight, so that you can differentiate the types of particles that make up the soil (soil, clay and silt). For elementary school, these activities are taken in schools; already to high school, they are presented in the Campus Day.

With the participation of 93 students working to awaken the curiosity of students and the soil behavior, environmental issues, and spark interest in engineering courses. The 'Soil Identification' is coordinated by Professor me. Maria Valeria Calijuri Mello Vieira Toniazzo and it takes place on Mondays in the afternoon.

3d printer

This Science Club segment develops a printer that performs three-dimensional printing and will be used in lectures in schools and completion of course work. The expected period for the completion of the printer is for the second semester. This is the second printer created by the students of the last semesters of Control and Automation Engineering (Mechatronics), the first was a simpler and smaller printer.

3D printer prints layer by layer of the object, asides reusing for printing newly printed materials that did not work or have no more use, thus avoiding damage to nature. The professor responsible for this action is Professor Dejahyr Lopes Junior. The group meets on Wednesdays and Fridays, at night

Robotics

The robotics group gives support to schools, enabling students of the Brazilian Olympiad of Informatics and Brazilian Olympiad of Robotics, and is currently developing prototypes as 3D clock and robots for competition.

This group is coordinated by Professor Dr. Dejahyr Junior Lopes and with the participation of students from the Computer Engineering courses and Control and Automation Engineering. Meetings are held on Thursdays, in the afternoon.

Macaroni Bridges

Scholars from the 5th semester of Civil Engineering have the challenge of building a bridge of one meter with 1 kg of macaroni for the competition that takes place within the Strength of Materials discipline. The competition is simple: the macaroni bridge that support more weight, is the winner. For this, you must have knowledge of calculation, resistance, materials, among others, and have to find a geometry that supports more load.

The bridges began to be built in August, and October is the finalization estimated period for the competition to happen. This aspect of the Science Club is coordinated by Professor Me. William Araujo Rosa and has about 50 participating students.


Astronomy

With a major highlight, the Astronomy Group leads the study of the celestial bodies, which nowadays is not so addressed to students from pre-school to high through lectures in schools, in UCDB and presentation at Campus Day. In the lectures for kindergarten, stars in a playful way are studied. The elementary school students make a rocket for launching and have lectures on basic astronomy. But in high school, asides working with more advanced lectures are developed activities associated with the Olympiad of Astronomy. The students also have the opportunity to learn more about astronomy in lectures in UCDB, fortnightly on Fridays.

The group is coordinated by Professor Me. Hilton Luiz Monteiro Junior and has the participation of 17 students from various courses, not necessarily of Engineering.

Physic

The Physics Group is coordinated by Professor Me Hilton Luiz Monteiro Junior and has two aspects: 'Wind tunnel for Structures Study Building Services', with students of Civil Engineering who seek to understand the influence that the wind exerts on buildings and houses as the question of breakdowns, cracks and slope; and 'Dams Simulation', which will begin this semester, also developed with students of Civil Engineering. This action seeks to study the strength and water pressure on the dam structure and soil. The Physics Group meets on Friday afternoon.

"Not limiting the Word" is the exhibition held by the Dom Bosco Catholic University in honor of the greatest Mato Grosso do sul writer, the poet

Manoel de Barros. Nine projects were selected for the facility that was set up in the wood bridge of UCDB and it stays to the end of August. Died in 2014, he would complete 100 years in December this year.

In 2000, the poet received the title of Honoris Causa Doctor of the Catholic, the highest honor granted by the institution. "To honor Manoel de Barros is to value what is most precious, which is our culture. And one of the purposes of UCDB is to promote and make our culture known. Manoel de Barros knew how to think about this wealth and translate it in poems and in literature. It is very good to see children, students and adults becoming knowledgeable of this project", said the Rector of UCDB, Fr. Ricardo Carlos at the exhibition opening, July 20.

In addition to the panels, the work of the last phase of the project 'Arte Transforma' are also exposed, where scholars of Architecture and Urban Planning and Design have reused public phones. Twelve pieces were painted by students and will be hanging in the trees, the exhibition entitled 'Telefone para passarinhos'.
