## Salesian pedagogy and its experience in the present day are topics of specialization

*Offered by UCDB Virtual, postgraduate is open enrollment*

Salesian pedagogy, inspired by the Father and Master of Youth, Saint John Bosco, is recognized worldwide for the efficiency of the education of children and young people. Even though he lived in the nineteenth century, the Catholic saint developed and taught methods that until today are considered effective means in education and dealing with youth. The knowledge, the reflection and the challenge of these educational foundations are some of the objectives of the post-graduation in Salesianity

offered by UCDB Virtual, which is open enrollment.

With a faculty composed of masters and doctors, the specialization aims to provide, through analysis of both historical and current conjuncture aspects, the knowledge and applicability of Don Bosco's pedagogical and pastoral teachings. There may be collaborators in Salesian works, members of the Salesian family and lay Christians interested in acquiring fundamental concepts in Salesianity.

There will be nine subjects taught at

a distance, through the UCDB Virtual - distance education area of the Dom Bosco Catholic University, Campo Grande (MS), institution with more than 50 years of tradition in higher education. Seven modules are specific disciplines, such as Don Bosco and his time, historical-critical elements of the evolution of Don Bosco's action as educator, youth Grammars, Salesianity and contemporaneity, among others, as well as two disciplines of scientific methodology.

"The life of Don Bosco has already

been and continues to be much studied and is known by those who admire him. What we want, in this specialization, besides deepening historical aspects, is to reflect on how to live its pedagogical teachings with the young people of today, with realities and contexts notoriously different from those of the times of the oratory of Valdocco. We believe that people are going to be motivated, to air their concepts and to update the knowledge", emphasized the coordinator of the graduate, professor Brasdorico Merqueades dos Santos, philosopher and post-graduate in Methodology of Higher Education, in distance education and in Salesianity and Master in Education.

The professor emphasizes that the modern world is challenging. "Who are our recipients and what are the ways to reach them significantly? All Salesian education is contextualized and, at the same time, faithful to the charism", added Brasdorico. "We want the Course Completion Work to be an effective application of the content taught and the student to build an experience at their place of work".

The members of the faculty are the President of the Salesian Mission of Mato Grosso, Fr. Gildasio Mendes dos Santos, and the Salesians Fr Afonso de Castro, Fr. Pedro Pereira Borges, Fr. Marcos Sandrini, Fr. Me Gillianno Mazzetto, in addition to UCDB professors Dr. Heitor Romero Marques, Dr. José Manfroi and Maria Luiza de Almeida Serra. ## Catholic professor clarifies about Outsourcing Law

Law No. 13,429, published in the Federal Official Gazette on March 31, 2017, amends Law No. 6,019/74 and allows the outsourcing of services performed in companies - including the end activities, that is, the main service performed in the establishment. Controversy, the matter gained prominence, as it makes the alteration of labor relations possible.

To talk about this subject, UCDB Newspaper talked to UCDB law professor, professor Hélio Santos Filho, master in Local Development and professor of Labor Law and Labor Process. See the main points of the interview:

**UCDB NEWSPAPER: In Practical, what changes with the new law on Outsourcing?**

**HELIO SANTOS FILHO:** Law No. 13,429, published in the Official Gazette of the Union, on March 31, 2017, amended Law No. 6,019/74, and inserted four articles on the outsourcing institute in the text of this law. Outsourcing is a phenomenon involving three subjects: the company providing services to third parties, the outsourced worker and the contracting company (client). With the publication of the new law, in practice, outsourcing any and all productive activity of the contracting companies was allowed. Previously, only outsourcing surveillance, conservation and cleaning services, as well as services related to the activity of third-party service providers were allowed. Outsourcing of the contracting company's end activity was not allowed. For example, an educational institution could outsource cleaning, surveillance, transportation, billing, and customer service, but outsourcing to teachers was not allowed. Another change refers to the possibility of outsourcing being carried out without the existence of an employment relationship. Until then, the company providing services to third parties hired the outsourced worker as its employee and placed it to provide services to the borrowers. With the new legislation, specifically paragraph 1, article 5-A of Law 6,019/74, the company providing services to third parties may subcontract other companies to provide the services contracted.

**UCDB NEWSPAPER: What labor rights cease to be guaranteed when a worker is outsourced?**

**HÉLIO:** No labor law will be withdrawn to any outsourced employee who is hired as an employee by the company providing services to third parties.

**UCDB NEWSPAPER: Can a company dismiss a bargain employee and rehire it as an outsourcer?**

**HELIO:** There is currently no legislation that prevents the employer from laying off their employees and hiring them through companies that offer outsourced services. There are in the bills that deal with the outsourcing and reform of labor laws, which are processed in the Federal Senate, the provision of a sort of quarantine, that is, if the employee is dismissed, can only provide services through outsourcing, after 180 days from dismissal.

**UCDB NEWSPAPER: What advantage will the worker have when outsourced?**

**HELIO:** In the case of outsourcing with an employment relationship, in which the outsourced employee is employed by the company that provides services to third parties, the advantage that the employee has is rela-

ted to the possibility of the outsourcer being responsible for the labor obligations and the payments during the period in which the outsourced worker rendered the services.

**JOURNAL UCDB: What is the advantage for the parties when opting for outsourcing?**

**HÉLIO:** In relation to the outsourced worker, the advantage is the greater guarantee in the receipt of your labor rights, since, if your employer, the company that provides services to third parties, does not pay you the labor obligations, the third-party taker will have to pay. With regard to outsourced service providers, client companies, the advantage that can come to them is that they will not have to worry about absences, medical and/or social security deviations from outsourced workers, since the company that provides services to third parties is that which is obliged to supply labor.

**JOURNAL UCDB: Many confuse the practice of outsourcing with the so-called "pejotização". Explain this difference.**

**HELIO:** Initially, it should be noted that there is no legal prohibition for a worker to provide services to another, as a legal entity. He can provide services to other companies as self-employed, without employment relationship. "Pejotization" is a term used in the labor market to talk about the distortion of the employment relationship. It is clear that the legislation guarantees more rights to the employee than to the provider of freelance services. He is entitled to 13° salary, vacation, FGTS, Weekly Remunerated Retirement, while the self-employed are not guaranteed such labor rights. Thus, it is clear that it is more advantageous for the employer to hire freelancers. In the so-called "pejotization" of the employment relationship, the employer determines that the employee or alleged jobseeker constitutes a legal entity and hires him as if the worker were a legal entity. Generally, a contract is made to provide autonomous services between legal entities, employee and employer, but in reality the worker provides his services as if employee were, therefore, in the employment relationship, all the requirements of the contract of employment are present. In particular, the provision of non-contingent services, by individuals, with subordination, personality and onerousness. Law 13,429/2017 brought the possibility of outsourcing through subcontracting of companies. That is, the company that provides services to third parties contracted to offer the services to the borrower (client company) subcontracts other companies, specifically, according to the provisions of paragraph 1 of article 5-A, of Law No. 6.019/74, To subcontract other companies to provide the contracted services.

Pension Reform, Tax on the Circulation of Goods and Services (ICMS), the restitution of amounts paid in tax substitution and public administration in court in the New Code of Civil Procedure (NCPC) are some of the topics discussed during the XIII Congress of Tax, Constitutional and Administrative Law and in the V Scientific Seminar of the UCDB, held on May 18 and 19 in Campo Grande.

The proposal of the event was to enable professionals and students of Law, Accounting, Administration, among other areas to discuss current issues in these areas. According to the course coordinator Elaine

Cler, the scholars were excited to be part of the event, because the exchange of knowledge with the great professionals of the area brings an enormous experience.

Based on the great interest of the students in the event, a Scientific Seminar was created, which allows students to present their articles and get in touch with the professionals present, and the two best works will be awarded.

## Interaction between university students and students promotes knowledge

*Through extension projects, academics go to schools and have the opportunity to exchange experiences and learn by teaching*

“To teach is to learn twice”. The meaning of this phrase said by the French writer Joseph Joubert between the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries can be lived in practice by the student of Control Engineering and Automation Leonardo Nantes Alves, aged 21. A year ago, he was a monitor in the OBI/OBR extension project of the Dom Bosco Catholic University (UCDB), which prepares elementary and high school students from Campo Grande schools to participate in the Brazilian Games of Informatics and Robotics.

From then on, when he passed on knowledge to about 50 students with the support of teachers Ana Karina

Vieira da Silva and Raphael Ceni Gomez, he also felt a difference in his own performance: “I had already seen the part of programming in the classroom, but I did not remember many details. So I had to study to be able to pass to the students, and this helped me later, when making more advanced programming”, he explained.

Like Leonardo, dozens of UCDB students have the opportunity to experience experiences like this during graduation. Of the 25 extension projects in the Institution, 10 are aimed at the exchange of knowledge among undergraduates and students in elementary and secondary educa-

tion. According to the coordinator of the Extension Programs and Projects sector, Edmara Martins de Souza, besides the students learning more, this is a way of being present in the communities and providing a social transformation.

“In having contact with different regions of the city, the student takes with him, besides the knowledge acquired in the classroom, the identity of the UCDB, marked by the Salesian principles, within the confessional character of the community and, therefore, awakens in the children and young participants of the projects, the desire to transform the realities in which they live, interacting in a dialo-

gical exchange, even wanting to be in the university environment and attend a graduation, reality for many that is still far”, Edmara concluded.

Extension projects that provide this interaction between the school and university environment involve courses from different areas of knowledge, such as Engineering, Agrarian Sciences, Nursing, Nutrition, Education and even Advertising and Propaganda. The actions come to promote health, culture, food safety, technical knowledge and also the importance of caring for the environment.

One of these projects is the “Horta Escola”, in which students and teachers of Agronomy provide

technical assistance for the implementation of a garden in the school environment. With support, school students and teachers themselves grow food that comes in addition to school lunches. In all, six schools and institutions participate in the project, one of them is the Licurgo Municipal School of Oliveira

Bastos, in Vila Nasser, in Campo Grande.

“The support of UCDB teachers and students is very important because they come in with the technical part and help us in the production of seedlings. This space inside the school is being used to teach students in different ways, not

only in the discipline of science, but also in others”, explained Professor Cintia Possas, responsible for the science laboratory.

In addition to learning from space, children also help care for food. Gabriel Leal da Silva dos Santos, aged 11, for example, is a 7th grader and is part of the science commit-

tee. His responsibility is to irrigate the vegetable garden once a week: “I come, I connect the irrigation system and the watering system with the irrigator, the beds that the hoses do not reach. It’s very nice to participate, I already know how the food is produced by the farmers and how they arrive at our table”.

## UCDB EXTENSION PROJECTS INVOLVING ELEMENTARY AND MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS



### BUILDING ENGINEERING KNOWLEDGE

Extension project aims to take to elementary and middle school students a basic knowledge of engineering, in addition to promoting the importance of preserving the environment and natural resources.



### YOUTH ENTREPRENEURSHIP

Students of Administration and Accounting Sciences promote training in entrepreneurship for students of the High School of the Paulo VI School and assist them in the creation and administration of a real company.



### UNIVERSITY FORMULA

Students of Computer, Mechanics, Control and Automation and Electrical Engineering develop a race car for competitions and, in addition to presenting the project to students of basic education, high school students interested in the career of pilot are trained to drive the vehicle.



### EDUCATION, ARTS AND SCIENCES

Education, arts and sciences - through workshops that promote the discussion of cultural and artistic issues and also storytelling, literacy scholars aim to stimulate critical thinking, reading and creativity in elementary and middle school students.



### GREEN CLICK

Students of the Advertising and Propaganda course teach, through photography, environmental education for adolescents in private and state schools.

### HEALTH PROMOTION AND FOOD SAFETY

Nursing and Nutrition Students pass guidelines on food and sanitation of foods for children in early childhood education and professionals at the Center for Early Childhood Education of UCDB São Domingos Sávio.

### SCIENCE CLUB

Through activities such as aeromodelling, pasta bridge competition, robotics, mechanics, astronomy and also a group of soil identification, UCDB Engineering students take knowledge of the area to basic education students.

### COMMUNITY ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION

In partnerships with municipal schools, Environmental Sanitary Engineering (ESA) and Agronomy students develop lectures and workshops to promote environmental awareness.



## Bird species of Campo Grande are cataloged

More than 130 different species have already been found in the reserve of the São Vicente Institute

With a close look at nature, attentive ears to the humming of the birds, camouflage suit, camera in hand and long-range audio recorder, the student of the 5th semester of Biological Sciences of the Don Bosco Catholic University (UCDB), Allan Corral Anjos, has already identified 135 species of birds that exist in the reserve of the São Vicente Institute (Lagoa da Cruz), in Campo Grande. The research that started two years ago is part of the Institutional Program for Scientific Initiation Scholarships (Pibic), to identify bird species in Campo Grande, and also the Ecology Group of Fragments (Ecofrag).

“The survey of the species reached a point of saturation, with almost all of them sampled, with about 135 species, a relatively large result for a small urban fragment, indicating that this forest spot works as a refuge for these species”, explains the author of search.

“It is a scientific work, it has a whole concern with the technical part for the monthly collection. With him, we will know what species exist in the place, an idea of how these species fluctuate during this period, because sometimes they appear more in some months of the year and, in others, they disappear. We also discovered migratory birds that pass in the reserve, because they may not be residents there, but they travel here”, explains the coordinator of the Biological Sciences course at UCDB, Luciana Mendes Valério.

The visits are made once a month by the student, when he goes through about five kilometers on reserve trails (126 hectares of fragments with native forest and dam), always wary of any movement or noise to register the species. Each expedition takes about four

hours, at dawn and dusk of the day, primarily at weekends. “I hope to be able to catalog all species of the reserve”, emphasizes the scholar.

“Of these species listed, some groups of birds, such as tyrannids [Tyrannidae family], have “nomadic” behavior, migrating from areas due to feeding, usually in warmer times such as from September to April. As well as some fruit-eating species that accompany the fruiting season of plants. Species such as rowing birds, pigeons [Columbiformes], parakeets, maritacas [Psittaciformes], among other groups remain in place throughout the year, due to the great occurrence of these birds in the region”, emphasizes Allan.

One of his achievements in this research is to have found a bird previously seen only in the south of Mato Grosso do Sul, but that will change the course of this story now because its species is already under analysis by the competent body. He reveals one of the curiosities when he cannot photograph the bird at first moment. “I record the sound produced with a directional microphone, and compare it with the sonogram of birds already cataloged. So I can accurately identify what it is, leaving only the photographic record”.

Scientific initiation research is about to be completed by next month, but will continue with Completion Work (TCC), and will be extended to two other native areas (the Surucuaru Forest of the UCDB Library, with approximately 130 hectares, And the Secret Park, with 180 hectares of forest).

The student wishes to continue in the academic life, to enter a masters and doctorate, to become professor of the area, besides acting like tourist guide in attractions of photographic safari.

**SOME OF THE SPECIES  
CATALOGED IN THE  
RESEARCH**



**Tucanuçu (Ramphastos toco)**  
Also known as toucan-toco, the tucanuçu is the largest of toucans, living throughout central Brazil and parts of the Amazon. In the Savanna and in the Atlantic Forest, the species can be found in greater number, in quick visits to orchards and trees with fruits.



**Arara-canindé (Ara ararauna)**  
A bird of unmistakable characteristics, with a bright blue color on the back and yellow on the ventral part, whose populations are distributed from Central America to Brazil, mainly in the central-western and northern regions of Brazil.



**Red-billed Woodpecker (Campephilus melanoleucos)**  
Also known as the Black-throated Woodpecker, it is a relatively large species, which lives in pairs or in groups of up to five individuals, tearing off the bark of large dead trees in search of insect larvae. In Brazil, they are found in the Amazon, Northeast, Midwest, and, to the south, to Paraná.



**Burrowing Owl (Athene cunicularia)**  
With the scientific name *cunicularia* ("small miner"), it receives this name by living in holes dug in the ground. It is found from Canada to Tierra del Fuego, as well as in almost all of Brazil except for the Amazon basin, being a small predator with a carnivorous-insectivorous habit, being considered generalist for consuming the most abundant prey according to the season. Rodent preference.



**Ariramba-beak (Galbula ruficauda)**  
Also called red-tailed ariramba, it is found in a large part of Brazil, in forested and dry areas, in denser environments, especially in its edges and glades.

# UCDB Library has 130,000 titles available for consultation

*The collection is one of the largest in Mato Grosso do Sul and assists in the research development*

Félix Zavattaro Library of the Catholic University of Don Bosco, which is open to students, collaborators and also to the local community, helps in the development of teaching, research and extension, offering resources that contribute to obtaining information in all areas of knowledge.

The collection consists of books, periodicals, monographs, reference works, CDs and DVDs, Braille materials and, in addition, has several copies of rare works that can be consulted on the spot

or borrowed. The bibliography is distributed in 105 shelves, all with sides A and B. In all, there are 130,000 titles available for consultation, which makes the library one of the largest in Mato Grosso do Sul, in number of copies.

Remote consultation is also available on the Capes Periódico portal with several national and international databases online. In some of these databases, if the user is within the Catholic, you will have access to a much larger number of periodicals due to the subscription of content.

The Library allows the student to make, through Pergamum - organizational software, online consultation, loans, renewals and material reserves. Through this application, the user can also check the search histories, debits, create a profile of interest to check new titles, update data, make suggestions and consult permanent basket (registered query memory).

Another service that the Pergamum system offers is the QR Code (Quick Response). This feature, which is used by an application on your smartphone, when the device's camera reads the code, displays bibliographic information on the screen that is decoded. The search data is read by this service and stored in the student's cell phone, which

you can share or save for future reference.

The collection also makes it possible for university students to provide bibliographical references for works, catalogs, in the case of students from UCDB's graduate programs, and bibliographic commutation - a program that brings together several periodical/thesis collections from several Brazilian libraries. Copies of articles from periodicals and theses that do not exist in the collection of the Library may be requested through COMUT.
