## September, month of the Bible

The month of September is dedicated to the Bible, but do you know why? In 1971, the Archdiocese of Belo Horizonte, which celebrated its 50th anniversary, proposed one month of Bible studies to all the faithful. These studies were conducted precisely in September, the month in which the Church commemorates St. Jerome, a priest who in the fourth century translated the Bible from Greek and Hebrew into Latin creating the "vulgata", a Latin word meaning popular, and which is used by the Church to this day. The faithful adhered with such commitment that the devotion spread and soon the CNBB officiated the date.

The Bible was not written in the way we know it, as a single book; in fact it is composed of several books that were written separately. Some estimate that these books were written from 1400 BC to

97 AD, and then assembled by Christian communities. By the year 200, the books that now make up our Bible began to be assembled until they were defined by the Church in the fifth century. Today the Bible is the best-known book in the world, translated into more than 2,000 languages and is present throughout the world.

One of the books of our Bible is St. Peter's second letter. In this letter, the Apostle says: "But know, above all, that no prophecy of Scripture arises from any particular interpretation. Because the prophecy never happened by human initiative; on the contrary, men moved by the Holy Spirit spoke as spokesmen of God" (2 Pet. 1: 20-21). The Bible is the Word of God, a God who loves us infinitely and who always wants our good.

Our way of responding to this love is to take advantage of this month to approach the Holy

Scriptures. Reading, meditating, praying what the Bible tells us is a way of listening to the voice of the Lord in our lives: a careful reading of the Word of God helps us to find the meaning of our life, to calm our hearts in the face of difficulties and to meditate and solve situations that often seem impossible. Jesus once said to the disciples: "My mother and my brothers are those who hear the Word of God and practice it" (Lk 8, 21).

May we, in this month and in all others, always cultivate the affection, respect and devotion that the Sacred Scriptures deserve. May they occupy a special place in our lives and in our hearts.

# UCDB Virtual opens eight new poles in 2017

*There are already 25 units in Brazil that promote easy access to students*

The quality is one of the values that Don Bosco Catholic University prioritizes in the educational scope. Based on this question, UCDB Virtual, the Catholic distance education arm, has expanded the teaching poles: now there are 25 training spaces spread throughout Brazil.

There are eight new poles that started to work this year, in addition to 17 already existing, in order to allow students faster access to face-to-face meetings. The cities covered are: Campinas (SP), Cuiabá (MT), Florianópolis (SC), Fortaleza (CE), São Luiz (MA), Teresina (PI) and Dourados and Três Lagoas, in Mato Grosso do Sul.

“Since 2005, when the Ministry of Education opened guidelines for the installation of new poles, UCDB Virtual is concerned with broadening access to students. By the end of 2018, our goal is to double the already existing amount in order to reach all regions of the country”, said UCDB Virtual director Jeferson Pistori.

Each pole functions as a support unit for face-to-face meetings of undergraduate distance courses offered by the Institution. This contact with pedagogical assistants is mandatory at the end of each semester, when students make assessments.

As many students live in cities different from the poles, they need to travel to do the tests and the creation of new units, for some, distances decreased.

“I believe that having a nearby access pole avoids fatigue with travel, it gives a much greater freedom and enables easy presence in all races. The presence of a new pole in Florianópolis is an opportunity for more young people, like me, to join UCDB, and have a greater convenience”, commented Clóvis Martins, 24, a Philosophy student, who is waiting for his transfer from Belém to Santa Catarina, where he lives.

In addition to facilitating the access of previously enrolled students, the creation of the

# University graduation Psychology students are organized into interdisciplinary groups and develop skills

*Works have weekly meetings, as well as events prepared by the students themselves*

Psychoanalysis, social and health psychology, meditation, behavior. Such subjects are so different from Psychology, but in Don Bosco Catholic University have the growing interest of students in common. At the initiative of the undergraduate students themselves, they gradually organized groups of discussions, with weekly meetings, which became events and now cover colleagues from other courses and semesters.

The coordinator of the UCDB Psychology course, Renan da Cunha Soares Junior, emphasizes that the most interesting of the groups is the total protagonism of the student - they are the ones who schedule timetables, lectures and events. "It has made students more interested in disciplines, so they have delved into the subjects of their respective interests", said the professor.

It all began in 2015, when students formed a study group of psychoanalysis. Since then, this autonomous organization of students

have grown, so that other themes have emerged, such as: Academic League of Psychoanalysis; Social and Health Psychology; Meditart (meditation and art); Behavior analysis and cognitive behavioral psychology.

According to Renan, for the participation of students to be increasing, each meeting takes place on an exclusive schedule. "The students used the coordination to enable the scale of the course, since it happens outside the class hours and so that the same member can participate in as many groups as he can and want."

Another question worked on the teams, is the interdisciplinarity, since they are open to all interested parties. "It's part of the job market, so it's important that from now on they see that all professions are interconnected", Renan concluded.

Gabriel Moreno is the manager of the Meditart group, and told us why he was interested in bringing this subject. "I always liked meditation and I realize that in college we

are very stressed; I have many friends who cannot complete a job because of anxiety and stress. And that helped a lot", said the academician. "Moreover, one of the reasons is to break the paradigm that college is a place that will only get you tired, but it can also be able to distract and relax".

For Adrielle Fernanda Linares, representative of the Academic Center of Psychology, the groups are essential, because the student does not depend on the teachers to delve into

the subjects. "The achievements of the groups come within the academic protagonism, we do not have to run after the professors", she emphasized.

The Group of Studies in Social and Health Psychology meets on Tuesdays at 1:00 p.m. the Meditart, at 1:30 p.m. on Thursday; the League of Psychoanalysis takes place biweekly on Mondays at 2:00 p.m.

# Nursing Clinic arrives to serve the population in basic health care

*Queries are made Monday through Thursday, from 8 AM*

In order to complete the clinical services already carried out such as Social Work, Psychology, Hearing Health, Nutrition, Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy and Physical Education support, the UCDB School Clinic now counts on the Nursing area in basic health care, pregnant women, newborns, children, adolescents, adults and elderly people of both sexes. The service is free and open to the Campo-Grandense community.

The coordinator of the Nursing Clinic, Eliny Salazar, points out that the person seeking the care will go through the screening and, on identifying the problem, the care or referral will be done. “We will carry out women’s health with preventive collection, breast examination, family planning, women’s health in obstetrics, course for pregnant women, hypertensives, diabetics,

children from newborns to adolescents, adults and the elderly”, she explained.

The professor also says that the UCDB School Clinic is kicking off to comply with the recommendation of the Brazilian Society of Pediatrics to apply an instrument for screening autism in childcare clinics, which consists of a questionnaire with 23 questions to parents, which may indicate traits of autism spectrum disorder.

The retired, Olívia de Lima, 80, who lives in Portal Lagoa, Campo Grande, is following Physical Therapy and Nutrition, because she feels pain in her knees. In the consultation of the day, she took the opportunity to pass the Nursing screening, in which she can check blood pressure, heart rate, among others. “I come here at the UCDB School Clinic because I am very well attended to”, she said.

The site also receives people from cities in the interior of the state, such as retired Corumbaense Tereza Cespedes, 60, who has doing speech therapy at UCDB School Clinic for two years now. “I really enjoyed the service. They’re checking to see if I need to put a hearing device on”.

“The clinic is the heart of any care, because we can find out everything. Check the patient’s signs, if he is in the standard, which is a reference according to the literature and also if there is some basic pathology, what we can treat or we have the autonomy to refer to another specialty”, explains the 10th semester student of Nursing, Guilherme da Silva Andrade.

“Here at the School Clinic, you get a broader picture of what Nursing can do, not just inside a hospital, not just helping the doctor. You can have autonomy to open your own

practice when you are trained”, commented the 10th semester student of UCDB Nursing, Lucas Melo.

All the attendance is done by the students of the 10th semester of Nursing, always supervised by teachers, from 8am to 5pm, Monday through Thursday. After screening, the patient will be referred to the doctor’s office and, if there is a need for medical intervention, the patient will be taken to the Basic Family Health Unit (UBSF).

The UCDB School Clinic counts on care in several areas, and will soon have the Pharmacy Clinic and, next year, the Clinic of Biomedicine.

Queries can be scheduled by phone or in person. The UCDB School Clinic is located at Avenida Tamandaré, 6,000, in Jardim Seminário, in Campo Grande. More information (67) 3312-3697 or 3705.



## Merit award guarantees free graduation for high school students

*This is the UCDB Challenge, largest MS scholarship program*

“It was the realization of a dream. I have always wanted to do Veterinary Medicine at the Don Bosco Catholic University because it is closer to home and to be sure that teaching is of a quality, since my cousin was trained here. Today I feel happy and fulfilled”, said Amanda Alves Rosa Taveira, 18.

The student is in the second half of a five-year journey to become a veterinarian. For her, the undergraduate course came as a gift. In 2016, she won a full scholarship through the UCDB Challenge - she was the best student at Nota Dez college. “It’s a great opportunity to continue my studies, especially in my reality, as it’s just me and my mother, It

would have been hard for her to bear the cost of a college degree”, Amanda said.

Considered the largest scholarship program in Mato Grosso do Sul, the UCDB Challenge has offered an average of 80 opportunities each year for high school students to graduate from the Catholic University with discounts from 50% up to 100% in tuition. In the eight editions already held, approximately 54 thousand students from 13 municipalities in the State have already competed for scholarships, and of the winners, currently about 100 are taking their undergraduate courses, and many others have already completed the courses. Now in 2017, in the ninth stage

of the program that will be held in October, other students will be able to compete for new scholarships for 2018.

“At the beginning of the program, the idea was to make a kind of simulation for the college entrance examination, but then the grade reached by the student became valid for the University selection process, and it was no longer necessary to make two assessments. From there, we thought: why not give a scholarship to the students who stood out? That is why we have instituted this award on merit. We are keen to have the best in our Institution”, said Natalli Meneguetti Idalgo Zayas, supervisor of the UCDB

Challenge and manager of the Catholic marketing sector.

It is not only enough to reach the best score among competitors. After entering the University, the student must continue to dedicate in his or her studies to maintain the scholarship. The benefit is renewable every semester and only four subject areas are tolerated.

It is through this opportunity that many teenagers become competent professionals. An example is Felipe Silva Alves de Oliveira, 25 years old. In the first UCDB Challenge held in 2008, he was the best student at the José Barbosa Rodrigues State School. With the integral scholarship he graduated in Administration and used the knowledge acquired to

pass in the competition of the Fire fighters Department. “I’ve been in the corporation for three years and I only got it thanks to what I learned during the course. I think the UCDB Challenge is incredible for these young people, it’s more of an option for those who want to join the University, but would not be able to afford the tuition,” he praised.

As many academics have already graduated, at the end of this year will be the turn of Kaio Queiroz dos Santos, aged 21. Like Felipe, the future nutritionist guaranteed 100% discount on tuition when he won the first place of the José Barbosa Rodrigues State School. “It was late 2014, a friend sent

me a message saying that I had the bag. I was very surprised and happy, because for me it was the UCDB, I had already chosen to study here, because who inspired me to be a nutritionist was a student,” explained Kaio

Already in the 8th semester of Nutrition, a few steps from graduating, in the stage of supervised internships, the academic already makes plans for the future: “The UCDB Challenge brought the beginning of my dream: to be a nutritionist. I still have many paths to follow such as the master’s and doctorate in the field of microbiology, I want to teach and teach nutrition to other young people,” he said.

## HOW DOES THE UCDB CHALLENGE WORK?

The Program is aimed at students who are regularly enrolled in the third year of high school in public and private schools in Campo Grande and in neighboring cities agreed with UCDB. It is also allowed the participation of students from preparatory courses for entrance exams of the schools agreed upon, provided they have finished high school.

The challenge consists of a test with 62 questions of multiple choice in the disciplines: Portuguese Language, Literature, Chemistry, Biology, Physics, History, Geography, General Knowledge, Mathematics, Foreign Language - English / Spanish and an essay, which is eliminatory. On the date of the evaluation, the student contests the scholarship with the students of the same pole as him, who wins the largest number of questions and obtains the highest score.

## POLOS

Schools interested in the UCDB Challenge should attend Campus Day - an initiative that brings high school students to the University so they know the structure and courses offered. After the visit, the college can become a polo if at least 50 students sign up to take the test. This gives local students the right to compete for a full scholarship for an undergraduate program of their choice. If the school has more than 101 enrolled, two scholarships will be made available, one integral and the other 50% discount, respectively for the first and second place.

If you do not have the minimum number of students required, there is the option for the colleges to unite and become a hub in a formal agreement. Students from schools that did not consider this option and have insufficient enrollment to be a polo can take the test at the UCDB

polo located at 6000 Tamandaré Avenue in Campo Grande. In this situation, students will compete for three scholarships - one full, one 70% discount in tuition and the other 50%.

## UCDB Challenge 2018: Psychologist gives tips on how to prepare for test and have good results

The UCDB Challenge 2018 - the largest scholarship program in Mato Grosso do Sul, offering graduation discounts from 50% to 100% is coming. On October 21 and 22, the evaluation will be applied to both the Catholic University Campus Don Bosco and the rest; so the psychologist Maria Inês dos Reis Pereira, who has been working with adolescents for 18 years at Don Bosco Salesian College, offers tips on how to prepare and get well in the competition. Read the interview below and check it out!

**UCDB JOURNAL:** How to draw up a study plan? How many hours should be allocated per day to study and why is this organization so important?

**MARIA INÊS DOS REIS PEREIRA:** Normally the high school student attends classes at one time of the day (morning, afternoon, night) or two (integral), so at another moment, when he is away from the classroom, get organized to have a good income. First you need to take care not to accumulate content, so what was passed by the teacher should be reviewed at home, or in a study booth if you prefer. It is interesting that the student rest from 15 minutes to half an hour when he arrives from school, and then begin his studies. Of course, it varies from person to person, but it is usually indicated that this student devotes from three to six hours of extraclassic study and that it always takes a break when half that time is reached, to do something I like or exercise, an activity that help prevent fatigue and increase concentration, since students tend to sit for a long time. All this organization is necessary so that the student creates the habit of study and, on the day of the test, has managed to absorb the maximum of the possible content and reach good results.

**UCDB JOURNAL:** The famous “aulões” of eve or pre-trial reviews really help? Are they indicated?

**MARIA INÊS:** For those who have organized and maintained a rhythm of daily study, both the “aulões” and the revisions are indicated yes, because they help the student to remember the content or another that he studied a long time ago. But it is not used for a student who did not plan, did not study, think that he will participate in these moments of revision and go well in the test, because this is not how it works. The content is extensive, and you can not learn everything from one day to the next. It is worth emphasizing that even these revisions should not be made exactly on the eve of the test, but rather a couple of days before, so that, on the date before the evaluation, the student can rest his head, after all, everything he has studied is already stored there. It is necessary to have fun, to talk with friends, to walk, all this is important to relax the mind and, the

other day, be rested for the test.

**UCDB JOURNAL:** It is well known that during the period of study, students tend to deal with pressure on a daily basis, which causes weariness, mainly emotional. How do you manage this to stay focused and achieve your goals?

**MARIA INÊS:** In addition to external pressure, usually from parents and family members, for the student to pass the test, the worst, in my opinion, is internal pressure - the fact that the student charges at all costs and, afraid of not being able to. This creates anxiety, the biggest villain in this process. For the pressure not to suffocate, it is necessary, besides organizing the studies, to look for valves of escape. Physical exercise is a great option: try to do a sports modality or gym because it relieves stress, improves cardiovascular and respiratory function, improves sleep quality and increases concentration. There are still students looking for other alternatives like acupuncture and relaxing massages, everything is valid if it is to help you stay calm.

**UCDB JOURNAL:** At the time of the test, what should be done to keep calm and deal with the “white”?

**MARIA INÊS:** First, arrive at least half an hour before the place of proof, especially if the environment is new to you, because there you can search the room and position yourself calmly. Arriving late, afraid of losing the evaluation, already generates an unnecessary nervousness and, for some people, it is difficult to recover later. Try to eat well, take water and, in the case of food, look for salty options, not just sweets, because the sugar in exaggeration can lower the pressure and cause drowsiness. If you took these precautions and still got nervous, breathe and exhale three times slowly. If necessary, go to the bathroom and do a stretching, this helps to relax the body and maintain concentration. In case of “white”, if you do not know the question mark it with an “x” and go to the next, do not waste time with the question that forgot the answer, focus the thought on another and then go back to answer the previous one, this helps to unlock the mind.

# Pedagogical Laboratory Interdisciplinary brings experience to undergraduate academics

*Extensionists creatively produce teaching materials to story telling for kids*

In the midst of didactic games, giant books, puppets and costumes, the imagination of literacy, pedagogy and biological sciences run wild when it comes to teaching. Comprised of 12 extension workers (six volunteers and six fellows), the Interdisciplinary Pedagogical Lab (Labinter) is the home of many academics who use art and literature to reach the hearts of the little students.

One of the many extension projects of the Catholic University of Don Bosco, Labinter is where academics use colorful space and high astral to develop more and more the love for the degrees. In the project, the extensionists creatively produce a variety of didactic materials, conduct storytelling for children from Catholic institutions and promote workshops for the training of storytelling teachers.

“The project expands the possibilities of teaching, allows the student to experience, visualize and experience moments that will serve as a baggage when he or she

will work in the area,” explained the professor of the degree and coordinator of the project Me. Suelen Regina Patriarcha Gracioli, who has been at the helm of Labinter since last year.

Lara de Andrade Medina, 17, an academic of the 2nd semester of Literature, has been on the project since the beginning of the year, and says that the same made her see teaching with other eyes. “We are always in touch with literature and community interaction is very strong as well. We produce knowledge here within our space and, outside, we have contact with children and it is wonderful to know more about children’s literature and see how it helps in the formation of the child as a reader, as a human being and in the realization of values,” he said.

A bias of the Labinter is environmental education, and subtly, academics try to add some values

of the theme in the activities with the children. “We look for in literature elements in common with environmental education, but without saying at any moment what we are doing, we use the accountant’s perspective to show this other side of

literature, because environmental education is a construction of values”, emphasizes the coordinator.

In addition to offering these services, Labinter also provides the materials developed for academics, teachers and even for the external public that wishes to carry out some activity. The site is also the source of many scientific initiation research projects (Pibid) and course completion work (TCC).

The love of teaching is what drives the academic extensionists of the project, and friendship and fellowship are very important values to them. “Here the exchange is something very present, we gather our strengths and weaknesses and we help each other. The staff of Letters helps those who have difficulty with writing; we, the Pedagogy, help to deal with children. The tie is so strong that we always say that whoever leaves Labinter never leaves Labinter,” said Tamara Durso, 25, an academic of the 2nd semester of Pedagogy.
