Groups initiate survey of environmental protection area information of Ceroula stream

Economic, social issues of the local population, types of agriculture, tourism, among others will be verified

The groups that make up the work of the Ceroula Stream Basin Management Plan, developed by the Dom Bosco Catholic University, are beginning to gather economic and social information on the local population, types of agriculture, tourism, fauna, flora and water analysis. and sediment. Earlier this month, members traveled about 100 kilometers of the stream-cutting region on technical visits, along with students who are part of the project.

All work has a team of researchers, technicians, students and the participation of UCDB Innovation and Entrepreneurship Agency (S-Inova), in

partnership with the Campo Grande City Hall, led by the Municipal Environment and Planning Agency. Urban (Planurb).

“We are making a diagnosis of information, collecting primary data to compare with secondary data we already have available for the region, so we can understand the behavior and propose zoning, which is one of the elements of the management plan, which will guide the activities that are already happening in the region and that will guide all this part”, explains the project coordinator by UCDB, teacher Ana Paula Teles. The entire study is expected to be completed by the end of the first half of 2020. Campo Grande has three Environmental Protection Areas (APA): Lajeado, Guariroba and Ceroula.

UCDB invests R\$ 650 thousand in reform of Basic Family Health Unit

Don Bosco Catholic University reopened, on the 14th, the renovation of the facilities of the Basic Family Health Unit “Mestre José Alberto Veronese” - UBSF UCDB Jardim Seminar. The University invested R\$ 650,000 in the work, modernizing the space of over 300 m², with large rooms for social assistance, immunization, waiting, dressing, inhalation, nursing, dentistry, three offices, among other environments.

“We have several health services, such as prenatal care, blood pressure measurement, vaccination of children”, explains the unit’s

manager, Letícia Alves de Oliveira. The unit operates from Monday to Friday, from 7am to 11am and from 1pm to 5pm.

The UBSF UCDB team also has the support of the Extended Family Health Center (NASF), with pediatrician, nutritionist, physical education professional, physiotherapist, speech therapist, gynecologist, psychologist, in addition to the support of UCDB academics, who also accompany calls in the neighborhoods. UCDB Science Dose Discusses Urban Mobility

Seventh edition of the event was held at Salomé Bar



The seventh edition of the Dose of Science of Dom Bosco Catholic University was held at the Salomé Bar, in Campo Grande, on the 16th, with a relaxed discussion on the theme “Urban mobility: for a city more mine”. The Science Dose project was created in June 2018 and repeats once a month.

Professors Fernando Camilo (architect specializing in urban planning and public development policies) and Dr. Fabiana Rabacow (Physical Education professional with a doctorate in preventive medicine)

participated in the debate, hosted by the professor of Architecture and Urbanism at UCDB Dr. Alessandro Campos.

“Failure to prioritize an individualistic mode, such as the car or motorcycle, is a matter of survival. But what other means of transport can we adopt? In Brazilian cities, many options can be applied, but then we have to think about the structure of these places. We have to allow citizens to walk, cycle and run without being exposed to risks”, said Fernando.





Active Child serves students from 6 to 14 years old and has open enrollment

The activities of the UCDB Active Child extension project have started again, but registration is still open. Children from 6 to 14 years old can participate, who, during school hours, have fun and learn from Catholic students and teachers for free.

The meetings take place every Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 7.30 am to 11

pm and from 1 pm to 4.30 pm.

Participants practice sports such as futsal, swimming, athletics, flag (derived from football), table tennis and badminton. In addition, children and adolescents can also participate in cultural moments such as dance classes, art and literature.

Enrollment of children in the extension project must be made by the guardians. They must attend the UCDB multi-sports complex where the project is being carried out and present a copy of the following documentation:

- ID and CPF of the guardian of the child / adolescent;
- CPF, RG and or Certificate of Birth of the child and / or adolescent;
- Proof of Social Identification Number - NIS;
- Proof of address;
- Vaccination card;
- School statement or proof of school.

Biotechnology and Environmental Science Programs Receive Special Student Registration

The Stricto Sensu programs in Biotechnology and in Environmental Science and Agricultural Sustainability at Dom Bosco Catholic University are open for special students. Both offer master's and doctoral degrees.

Those interested in the Agroenvironmental program must have a higher level diploma and/or undergraduate students who are in the last year of the course, in the areas of Environmental, Agrarian, Biological and Related Sciences. According to the announcement, the disciplines of "Mechanisms of

resistance of plants and insects" and "Sustainability and Agrofuels" are offered, as well as the condensed subjects: Parasitic Biology, Special Topics - Biosafety, Multivariate Data Treatment and Analysis, Forest Genetic Improvement. and sustainability, Environmental ethics and agricultural sustainability and Sanitation and sustainable production.

The program in Biotechnology has the following subjects: Parasitic Biology, Biosafety, Interactions between plants, insects and microorganisms, Mechanisms of defense against infections and Teaching Practices in Biotechnology.

Registration is open until October 15th. Both programs run at UCDB's Bioshealth block from Monday to Friday, from 7:30 am to 11 am and from 1 pm to 4 pm.
