

In September, there were two national announcements in which Don Bosco Catholic University stood out and which we bring in this edition of the Catholic newspaper. First, it was the four-year evaluation of the Coordination of Improvement of Higher Education Personnel (Capes), foundation of the Ministry of Education, which classified all Master's and Doctoral programs of UCDB with grades 5 (Local Development and Education) and 4 (Biotechnology, Environmental

Sciences and Agricultural Sustainability and Psychology). We share these good results with the entire academic community, especially our professors who develop relevant works for society with their research.

The second publication also makes us proud. In the University Ranking Folha (RUF), a survey conducted by Datafolha and published by Folha de S.Paulo and UOL portal, UCDB was confirmed as the best private university in Mato Grosso Sul and is among the 110 best in the country. In relation to the ranking of last year, we climbed 37 positions, confirming the constant improvement of the Institution. A large part of this educational force will be exhibited during the fourth edition of the Congress of Saberes em Ação on October 24, 25 and 26. The event is already traditional in

UCDB and confirms itself as the largest scientific event in the State, reaching international standards, with the coming of speakers, debaters and students from other countries. It is a unique opportunity to see, hear, speak and learn with students, academics, teachers and administrators and show what the community best produces in the academic field.

In this edition of the UCDB Newspaper, we also bring the new Clinic-School service, this time in the area of Pharmacy, and the laboratory of autism and human behavior, developed by the Master's and Doctorate Program in Psychology.

Ranking of Folha confirms UCDB as the best MS individual for the 2nd consecutive year

Don Bosco Catholic University was confirmed, for the second consecutive year, as the best private higher education institution in Mato Grosso do Sul, this time by the University University Ranking (RUF 2017). The Institution has improved 37 positions and moved from the 146th national place, obtained in 2016, to the 109th best in the country. The score obtained by the UCDB guarantees it among the best universities in the Midwest.

RUF analyzes five questions: teaching, research, market, innovation and internationalization. In four of them, UCDB improved in the ranking compared to the previous year, a tendency that had been confirmed since 2015, when the Institution had already improved in all aspects analyzed by Datafolha and disclosed by Folha de S.Paulo and

UOL (ruf.folha.uol.com.br).

“In addition to teaching work, which is essential for academic education, we have a serious commitment to extension and research at universities. Only in this last item evaluated by the RUF, we jumped from 146th place to 115th place. It is a work that has been recognized”, said the Dean of UCDB, Fr. Ricardo Carlos. Still in the research question, another highlight is the average of citations per article, in which Catholic appears in the 63rd position - the best in Mato Grosso do Sul.

Along with the Ranking of Universities, is also published, the Ranking of Courses. The graduations of the Catholic in Design, Civil Engineering, Control Engineering and Automation and Social Service appear as the best in the State.

STUDENT GUIDE

Another recent disclosure confirms the quality of UCDB courses. This month, the “Best Universities 2017 Student Guide”, published by Editora Abril, will be launched. In the publication, Biological Sciences - Bachelor of UCDB won five stars, in addition to all courses of the Institution appear “starry”.

Eleven UCDB undergraduate programs have four stars (Administration, Law, Physical Education - Bachelor Degree, Physical Education - Bachelor, Nursing, Control

and Automation Engineering, History, Literature, Pedagogy, Psychology and Social Work) and another 15 with three stars Agronomy, Biological Sciences - Bachelor, Accounting, Design, Sanitary and Environmental Engineering, Civil Engineering, Computer Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Pharmacy, Physiotherapy, Journalism, Veterinary Medicine, Nutrition, Advertising and Zootecnics).

The main highlight was for undergraduate courses at UCDB. All offered by the Institution had 4 or 5

stars - Biological Sciences, Physical Education, History, Literature and Pedagogy.

The Student Guide conducts the evaluation of the Brazilian higher education courses, issuing grades three (good), four (very good) or five (excellent) stars, which points out the best Higher Education Institutions (IES) in Brazil - public and private - and those that stood out the most in eight areas of knowledge, besides serving as a parameter for the choice of future academics.

Saberes em ação is a great exchange of knowledge of undergraduate, research and extension

Already in the fourth edition, the Congress of Research, Teaching and Extension – Saberes em ação will be held between the 24th and 26th of this month. At each stage of the biggest event promoted by Don Bosco Catholic University, the actions are further expanded. Learn how the congress has evolved over the years and the news for 2017, when reading this interview with Pro-Dean of Extension and Community Affairs, Dr. Luciane Pinho de Almeida.

UCDB NEWSPAPER: With each edition, Saberes em ação has grown, not only in registration, but also in scope. Was this expected? What is the difference of this IV congress?

LUCIANE PINHO DE ALMEIDA: This is an event that was built together with the academic community, and in the first edition we were surprised by the great adhesion. From then on, there were only more good surprises, and what was once internal, opened the doors for all universities to participate. And several institutions, not only Campo Grande, but also the country ended up participating in Saberes em ação. We also decided to include high school students in the congress, so that this audience began, from an early age, to have contact with the university environment and, once again, we were happy with their presence. Now, even after so many steps, the IV edition of Saberes em Ação surprises us with the growth of 30% in the number of entries registered in relation to last year, something that comes not only in quantity but also in the quality of these materials. Not to mention that, this time, we will move towards internationalization. We will have the presence of five institutions that are linked to the bioceanic university network, several works of students who carry out research in South America have been registered and we will also have the presence of a researcher from the University of Limoges (France). In the face of all this expansion of the Congress, we expect to reach this year's edition of 12,000.

UCDB NEWSPAPER: To insert high school students in the Congress was to bring them closer

to the University. In this IV edition, is something going specifically for them?

LUCIANE: We have signed a partnership with the Municipality of Campo Grande through the Municipal Youth Office and we will receive around 700 high school students here. This time, this public enrolled 19 projects that will be presented through banners and, moreover, we will promote a lecture specifically addressed to them. As the Enem and entrance exams are coming, writing is one of the most difficult issues for students. In this way, we invite the linguistic teacher Dad Squarisi to pass on the text structures, cultured norm and also possible topics that can be collected in the test.

UCDB NEWSPAPER: Does this great integration between graduate students, undergraduate and high school students, besides providing knowledge exchange, also bring more visibility to the researches and studies developed?

LUCIANE: Saberes em Ação is nothing more than a great exchange of knowledge, the reason for the name. Here the students can know everything that is being developed in the field of research, extension and teaching. With the increasing presence of students from other institutions and even from abroad, this exchange is more intense, it is an expressive way of disseminating what is produced within UCDB. In addition, the best works are published in the annals of the event, a way for students to show the study developed, as well as a way to value the commitment of the student and to make this knowledge produced here surpass the walls of the University and be able to transform realities.

High school students will have lecture on Writing

One of the students' great fears, the Writing, will be the theme of a special lecture held during IV Saberes em Ação. For secondary students, the event will be with teacher and writer Dad Squarisi, on the 25th, at 1:30 p.m. UCDB sports courts.

Dad is Editor of Opinion of the newspaper Correio Braziliense and is a columnist for the newspaper Estado de Minas, besides writing for Dad's Blog and being a teacher at the University Center of Brasília. She is the author of eight books on Portuguese and writing. In addition, he participates in competitions evaluation centers and lectures on communication and oral and written expression.

Several schools were invited to attend the event, which takes place only a few days after Enem is held in November. In partnership with the Municipal Youth Office of Campo Grande, about 200 students who study at the Levanta Juventude course also participate in the event.

“The classes of the preparatory course take place every Saturday morning at the Municipal Institute of Campo Grande, but we will invite everyone to participate in this meeting, so important for the students to perform well in the test”, said the Under-Secretary for Youth Field Policies of Campo Grande, Maicon Nogueira.

Congress becomes international and increases the number of papers presented by 30%

There are 866 papers presented, in addition to 61 workshops and 60 other products on

With a roundtable on academic cooperation on the bioceanic route, the fourth edition of Saberes em Ação becomes even more international. The participation of representatives from Chile, Paraguay, Argentina, as well as researcher from France in one of the 12 round-tables, and the presentation of works by Chilean scholars, are confirmed. The congress is considered the largest scientific event in Mato Grosso do Sul, held from October 24 to 26 at UCDB, with extensive programming.

This year, there was a 30% increase in the number of entries registered compared to last year. Only in undergraduate studies were 839 submissions, 219 graduate, 19 high school and 12 tertúlias - a total of 1,089 jobs registered and 866

approved. They will be presented in classrooms (in oral presentations) or in the form of banners.

The public will also be able to participate in 61 workshops and confer more than 60 products exhibited at the show - two already traditional activities at the congress.

The program begins on Tuesday, 24th, with the presentations of the XXI Scientific Initiation Meeting and the launch of 15 books, in the Administrative Block, at 5pm. Then at 19pm, former gymnast Laís Souza addresses the main theme of the event "University: Inclusion and Overcoming". On the 25th and 26th, activities for the academic community and visitors continue throughout the campus.

Programs in Local Development and Education of UCDB receive score 5 from Capes

In Biotechnology, in Environmental Sciences and in Psychology, the scores obtained were 4

The master's and doctoral programs in Local Development and Education of the Don Bosco Catholic University obtained the score 5 in the evaluation of the Coordination of Improvement of Higher Education Personnel (Capes), foundation of the Ministry of Education (MEC). The programs in Biotechnology, Environmental Sciences and Agricultural Sustainability and in Psychology were classified with score 4, confirming the quality of courses *stricto sensu* da Católica.

"These results crowned the great institutional effort and commitment of our excellent

teaching and administrative staff, which has been intensely dedicated to building a world-class university. We intend to continue on the path of excellence and contribute to the training of highly qualified personnel, the production of scientific knowledge for our State and the sharing of this knowledge through interaction with companies, governments and society in general", said the Pro-Dean of UCDB, Dr. Emerson Pistori.

The coordinator of the Local Development Program, Dr. Arlinda Cantero Dorsa, also celebrated the result. "We started the PhD in Local Development in 2016 and we have been very committed to, for example,

exchanges between programs, in the publications of professors and students, strengthening research groups with well-founded lines". He added: "It's a great achievement, but now we are working with new challenges: the internationalization of the program, greater academic mobility and increasing social insertion". The PPGDL has two lines of research, Culture, identity and diversity in territorial dynamics and Public policies and dynamics of innovation in territorial development.

According to data from Capes, the evaluation is done every four years and was conducted by 1,550 consultants, who evaluated 4,175 programs and 6,303 courses, of which

3,398 are masters, 2,202 are PhDs and 703 are professional masters. UCDB now has the highest average of concepts (4.4) and also the highest percentage of programs with concepts equal to or greater than 5 (40%) among all public and private universities in the state of Mato Grosso do Sul.

"The first point to highlight is the improvement of our evaluation, which is linked to an Institution's policy, enhancing the *stricto sensu* master's and doctoral postgraduate programs. A second issue that I consider important is the way we are working on the program, in articulation with the professors and with the students. We come in a sum of procedures that made us get there. UCDB is with its *stricto sensu* graduate programs working in a serious and responsible manner. We have credibility within the academic world in all of Brazil, depending on what we are doing, and this is for all programs, this is not only the



PROGRAMS

In all, UCDB has five *Stricto Sensu* graduate programs, which were evaluated by Capes and received good and very good concepts. In addition to these, the Institution also has the Doctoral Program in Biotechnology and Biodiversity Network, formed by ten universities in Mato Grosso do Sul, Mato Grosso, Goiás and the Federal District, and an International Master in Sustainable Territorial Development Erasmus Mundus - international consortium graduated from UCDB, University of Sorbonne - Paris 1 (France), University of Louvain (Belgium) and University of Padova (Italy).

MASTER AND DOCTORATE IN BIOTECHNOLOGY

The UCDB Postgraduate Program in Biotechnology aims to develop scientific and professional competences at the Master level, through Science, Technology and Innovation; to raise the intellectual level of society through the training of qualified personnel for the exercise of research activities and/or higher teaching in the area of Biotechnology. There are four lines of research: Bioeconomics and conservation of natural resources, Biotechnology, Science, technology and innovation for the sustainability of the Midwest and Development of biotechnological products, processes and services. MASTER AND DOCTORAL IN ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCES AND AGRICULTURAL SUSTAINABILITY

The most recent program created at the UCDB in 2012, the Master's and Doctorate in Environmental Sciences and Agricultural Sustainability aims to develop scientific and professional skills through science, technology and innovation. The research takes place in two lines: Agribusiness and sustainable production and Health, environment and sustainability. More information (67) 3312-3702.

two programs that scored five”, said Dr. Heitor Queiroz de Medeiros.

PPGE is the oldest program of the Catholic and currently works with three lines of research: Educational policies, school management and teacher training; Pedagogical practices and their relationship with teacher education; and Cultural diversity and indigenous education.

Programs with at least one year of operation were analyzed, and the commissions used the information provided

continuously by the programs as a basis, through the Sucupira Platform. The evaluation criteria consider five questions: program proposal, faculty, student body, intellectual production and social insertion.

Scores 6 and 7 indicate programs with international standards of excellence - reached by only 11% of those assessed; scores 4 and 5 represent performance between “good” and “very good”; and courses with minimum quality standards, with average performance, are assigned grade 3.

MASTER AND DOCTORATE IN PSYCHOLOGY

It began its master's degree in 1997 and his PhD in 2012, being the first doctorate in the State, receiving students from several municipalities of MS and Mato Grosso. It currently has ten research groups and has the work divided into two lines of research: Health evaluation and assistance and Public policies, culture and social productions. The general objective of the Program is to train qualified professors and researchers for the teaching and research of contemporary health processes through the analysis of different practices, discourses and institutions.

Guide, monitor and evaluate the use of drugs are some of the duties of pharmacists

Calls are free, made from Tuesday to Thursday, from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., at the Clínicas-Escola UCDB

Orientate the patient on the use of prescribed drugs; evaluate the set of medications used as dosage, time of consumption, possible interactions and duration of drug use; refer patients to health professionals; talk with the patient about symptoms and disease progression; and prescribe medicines that are exempt from medical prescription are some of the duties of pharmacists in compliance with Resolution 585 of August 29, 2013, which regulates the clinical duties of the pharmacist, and Law 13.021 of August 8, 2014, that provides for the exercise and supervision of pharmaceutical

activities.

UCDB Pharmacy-Clinic arrives precisely to meet all these requirements and ensure humanized care to employees, patients of the Basic Family Health Unit (UBSF-UCDB), Clinic-School, students, teachers and spontaneous demand. “The concern with the integral training of UCDB academic has a mission: to contemplate, through practical activities, the curricular basis of the courses of Pharmacy”, celebrated the coordinator of the Pharmacy course, professor Marla Ribeiro Arima Miranda.

The Pharmacy-Clinic, which integrates the other free health services provided by UCDB, is

equipped with four consulting rooms for pharmaceutical care and a supervisory room, counting on the academic work and three professors: Maria de Lourdes Oshiro, Elisângela de Oliveira and coordinator Marla. “We find duplication of prescriptions, since the search for emergency and outpatient clinical care generates new prescriptions of drugs with the same clinical indication, and the patient ends up using a much larger dosage. This can lead to intoxication,” Marla warned.

She also points out that there are several aggravating factors for the use of drugs without proper guidance, called PRM (Drug Related Problems), for example, drug interactions generate pharmacological antagonism. “The patient makes use of two medicines, one eliminates the effect of the other, which is very worrying, because it does not have therapeutic efficacy. And this is what the professional graduated in Pharmacy can identify and guide the patient”, explained the coordinator.

The retired Lúcia Gondim Peralta, 70, takes several medications to fight diabetes, cholesterol, hypertension and other diseases. She took advantage of the UCDB School Clinic, where she does pulmonary physiotherapy, to see if she is correctly using



the medication because she stopped taking the prescribed medication for hypertension on her own. “There’s a lot of prescription medicine that I think is not for me. I really like natural medicines”.

With clinical care, doubts like this and others, such as the time to take the medication or even know the dosage better, can be clarified. “We will be here to help, guide people on how to take this medicine, explain what it is for, how it will act in the body and indicate the time that will be given to it”, said the 10th semester lecturer in Pharmacy, Dilma Caroline Dagostin.

Academician Gabrielly Gonçalves Albuquerque, from the 10th semester of Pharmacy, emphasizes that the internship is an opportunity to learn in practice everything seen in theory. “The experience is enriching, because it is a new area here at the University, as well as outside it. We are going

to leave here with experience for the field of work and attend the patients with better quality”.

Gislaine dos Santos Garcia, a student from the 10th semester of Pharmacy, is enthusiastic about the new opportunity. “The hope is that I can help people who use medication and with that I can gain experience in pharmaceutical clinical services”.

But the problems go much further, and a simple association of food with a given drug may negate the desired therapeutic effect. “There are antibiotics that cannot be ingested with milk. Because milk is a calcium-rich protein food, calcium ions may interact with the drug by promoting a type of chemical precipitation reaction, that is, by nullifying the effect of that drug. Other medicines need to be used after meals”, he concluded.



CORRECT USE OF MEDICINES

The use of medications incorrectly can lead to complications of a disease and mask some signs and symptoms. Inappropriate combination of medications may negate or potentiate the effect of the other, making it a health hazard.



PHARMACEUTICAL ORIENTATION

The pharmacist advises the patient on how to use and store medicines. Warns about side effects, interactions and likely adverse drug reactions, including the risks of improper use of medication, such as self-medication.



ATTENTION TO THE HYPERTENSIVE AND DIABETIC

Pharmaceutical care for the hypertensive and diabetic patient is aimed at the control of the disease, with attention to possible ocular, renal and cardiovascular injuries and in other organs. At the pharmaceutical appointment, blood pressure measurement, capillary glycemia test, and review of drug therapy are performed.



FOLLOW-UP FOR LABORATORY EXAMS

The results of laboratory tests contribute to the effectiveness and of treatment success.



ELDERLY CARE CUSTOMER SERVICE

The elderly are the ones who most feel the drug interactions because their body, over time, becomes more vulnerable to diseases, causing them to use many medications. For this group, the pharmaceutical activities are fundamental.

UCDB Laboratory develops techniques to assist autistic students in language learning

Research is linked to the Graduate Program in Psychology

As one of the main characteristics of the autistic is the difficulty of social interaction and communication, studies carried out in the Research Laboratory in Autism and Applied Human Behavior of Don Bosco Catholic University seek to identify techniques in the behavioral line that can help and increase the learning of children and teenagers carriers of the disorder.

Currently, five students from the Postgraduate Program in Psychology (Master's and Doctorate) and three from the scientific initiation work under the coordination of Professor André Augusto Borges Varela. "We seek more effective treatments, then we identify what happens to these children who cannot develop the language and try to produce interventions that will teach this to the child, so that it develops the symbolic learning, that is, is able to relate the sound of the word with some object, for example", André explained.

There are about 20 autistic children and teenagers

volunteers who are assisted in specialized institutions, such as the Association of Parents and Friends of the Autistic of Campo Grande (AMA), the Apae of the municipality and also in the house where they live. As is the case of Alice*, 11 years old, who for 12 months is accompanied by the student of the 8th semester of Psychology that integrates the scientific initiation Jennifer Vieira de Araújo.

"In the method worked with Alice *, I used tokens that showed three different state flags and other tokens with the map drawing for each state, so she learned to associate the state name with each flag and with each map and then passed to relate the map to the flag. There was a great evolution, because she managed to connect the word with the image", clarified Jennifer.

The development of Alice* was noticeable, especially for the family. Her mother, Claudia*, a primary school teacher, explained that her quality of life improved, and the relationship with others

also: "My daughter has developed a lot, especially in the area of concentration and assimilation. Depending on the theme, she can associate the word with what it represents and memorize it. I realize that in this process, she stays focused, something that interfered at home, she can play alone in the room and play on the tablet,

something that she previously had no patience.

More than helping the conviviality and the development of communication of autistic children and teenagers, the researchers also aim to identify ways to optimize therapeutic interventions and facilitate the work of professionals in the field. To that end, the 29-year-old master student, Larissa Bezerra de Melo, seeks to understand the prerequisites that autistics need in order to develop speech and to relate the sound of the word and the object to which it corresponds.

The work is developed based on the ABLA test - a device that assesses the child's learning level from one to six. The first is the simplest process of imitation, and the last is when one can make connections between sounds and objects and memorize it. "In my research, I wanted to identify whether children and teenagers who fit into levels four and five could also learn how to level six, and I realized that they did not. Showing this to professionals is important because knowing the way children learn helps the psychologist to plan the therapeutic intervention and be more assertive", he said.

CREATION OF A CENTER OF INTERVENTION AND RESEARCH IN AUTISM

In the face of the work already developed in the Laboratory, a partnership was signed this year with the State University of Utah (United States), which is a reference in the treatment of autism. With the support of international institutions, the aim is to create a center for intervention and research in autism in the Clínica-Escola da Católica (Catholic School Clinic) with the objective of assisting needy children and teenagers who have the disorder and also to train professionals who wish to work in the area. "We want to offer better attention to children with autism who depend on public health, because this most needy public, most of the time, is without quality care, and along with that, there is a great demand in Campo Grande and in Brazil of professionals who know how to do this type of treatment, we intend to train people through the postgraduate so they can work in the area and produce positive effects in the lives of several autism sufferers ", said Professor André Varela.
